★ What is Operation Good Cheer?

Operation Good Cheer is a Christmas gift giving program sponsored and coordinated by Child and Family Charities. The program was created in 1971 by an individual who wanted to make a difference in the lives of children that were not in their own homes for Christmas, but were placed in a foster care home.

★ Who does Operation Good Cheer Serve?

Recipients of the program are individual's 0-21 that are vulnerable and adults with disabilities in an authorized out-of-home placement such as foster care, a residential facility, or group home. Repents include infants, children, teenagers, young adults and adults with disabilities.

★ Most recent data for Operation Good Cheer

In 2024
6,730 Children were sponsored
20,190 Gifts delivered
105 Non-profit Agencies across Michigan participated
190 Donor groups, individuals, and companies sponsored children
29 Transport Companies donated their time, fuel, and trucks, 248
Pilots signed up with flights to 33 Airports, 1,000+ Volunteers
donated their time and services for gift delivery
